

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

We delight in the beauty of the butterfly but rarely admit the changes it has gone through to achieve that beauty. It is the change that we all go through our lives that constantly improves us, and with Maya Angelou's words portraying this thought in the most dazzling way possible, I would like to present the annual report of the session 2019-20.

I begin by sharing with you the performance of Tagorians in the CBSE exam 2018-19. We had an overall result of 98.25 percent for the class X CBSE exam during the session 2018-19. Close to 50 students received 90% or more in one or more subjects.

In class XII, out of the 213 students who appeared for the exam, 206 students were successful and 190 got first division and 16 secured 2nd division.7 students had to appear for their re-exam. A major section of students secured 80-90% marks in one or more subjects. A detailed account of the CBSE results follows in this journal.

The other highlights of the current session are as follows:

The new session commenced from the 4th of April 2019. Students were excited and enthusiastic about attending their new classes. In context with the **Pre Primary Wing**, the Nursery entrants enjoyed the **Fresher's Party** thrown for them at the beginning of the session. This year, the little ones also enjoyed a

wonderful tete-a-tete with their amazing friend, Little Ganesha to mark *Ganesh Chaturthi*. A soulful *Aarti*, *Ganesh Vandana* Dance presentation, a heartfelt *bhajan* rendition were some of the items presented at a cultural programme to mark the Utsav. The oratory skills of the Pre Primarians could be visualised by way of excellent recitals on Myself and My Family. The young patriots displayed their dedication towards their motherland through a Speech Competition on the 9th of August 2019.

Rakhi making activity was another area where the little ones showed their creativity and they enacted the role of the saviours of the environment by tying rakhis onto the green plants. The 13th of September 2019 saw the tiny tots display their role enactment skills by presenting short skits on the topics---Ekta Mein Bal, Guru ki Shiksha and Laalach ka Phal. A special endeavour in order to create an awareness towards imbibing healthy habits and maintain high levels of hygiene, the HANDWASH activity was also organised by the Pre Primary Wing. Organising Mother's Meet was another step towards creating a stronger and more affectionate mother-child bond during the most formative years of a child's good upbringing.

The little ones also won laurels for their school by winning many prizes in 'Aashayein', an inter-institutional competitive confluence organized by Naveen Shishu Vatika on 8th November 2019. English Recitation (II prize), Doha Recital Competition (II prize), Creativity Corner (I prize), Art Attack (II prize) and Salad



Decoration (II prize) saw the participation of the Pre-Primary Wing.

The little ones also bagged I & II prizes in a dance competition held at Prayag Sangeet Samiti.

The Preparatory class children also participated in various sports events held at Bethany Convent, Naini.

A gist of the vast variety of events and fests organized and enjoyed by us since the beginning of this session are as follows:

- We observed the Constitution Day in honour of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, as per the guidelines set forth by the CBSE. A quiz, Poster-making and Power Point presentations based on our Constitution were arranged to mark the occasion. Oath taking ceremony on 26th November'19 at 11:00 hrs. marked the solemn occasion.
- On the 1st of May'19, to celebrate the Utility Staff Day, an enjoyable cultural programme was organized to provide the helpers of our school with a rejuvenating break from their regular routine. Later, they were suitably felicitated as a mark of recognition of their invaluable services to their institution.
- On the 7th of May '19, we celebrated Gurudev Tagore's birthday. A series of competitions was organized to display the multifarious talents of our children through picture colouring, calligraphy, recitation, collage making, to name a few.

A classroom decoration competition was organised on 29 July 2019 for all the classes. The class wise themes of the event were—Rainbow, Motherland, Technology and its Implementation, Eye Donation, Ethics, Without Teachers Life Would have no Class, Unsung Heroes Of India, to name a few. The students came up with wonderful pieces of art and decoration covering almost every topic of study at the school level.

The Investiture Ceremony on the 7th of August, 2019 saw the installation of the new office bearers of Tagore Public School. They were formally invested with their respective portfolios at an impressive function. Swaraj Week was organised from the 5th to the 10th of August 2019. Recitation, patriotic songs (solo and group), declamation and radio shows in Hindi and Sanskrit were arranged with an aim to awaken the spirit of patriotism in the students' mind.

Independence Day was celebrated with patriotic fervor to pay rich tributes to the glorious martyrs of our nation.

- An extensive fortnight long programme to create an awareness towards maintaining cleanliness and hygiene was chalked out and marked to be observed from the 1st to the 15th of September 2019.The 15 day long Swachhta Pakhwada included Shapath Day, Awareness Day, Handwash Day, Action Day and Letter Day.
- A wonderful power packed programme was presented by our enthusiastic



students for the educationists on the 5th of September. It was a fine depiction of their dedication and sincerity towards their Gurus for which we shall always be thankful to them.

On the 14th of September 2019, we celebrated Hindi Divas by organizing a set of competitive events. The senior section dedicated the morning assembly to this celebration with informative speeches, amusing proverbial poem recital and chorus singing. A set of cultural enactments were also presented by our little ones on this occasion.

On 2nd October, on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, we offered floral tributes to the Father of the Nation and our past Prime Minister, Lal Bahadur Shastri and also sang famous couplets and Ramdhun.

- On 23rd October, the students of classes 6-8 took out the No Crackers Rally in the area adjoining the School to make the public aware of the harmful effects of crackers on the environment and human health.
- On 31st October, we observed the National Unity Day by taking out a rally to commemorate the invaluable contribution of the Iron man of our country, Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel towards the freedom struggle. The students were also administered the oath of unity and solidarity.
- On 2nd and 3rd November we celebrated Unnayan, our Annual Cultural and Felicitation Ceremony with gaiety and zeal.

As per the guidelines set forth by the CBSE, we solemnly observed the World Constitution Day by taking the oath at the specified time on 26th November 2019.

WORKSHOPS AND SEMINARS:

In order to update our teachers with innovative trends in education, we encourage them to attend **workshops and seminars** on various subjects.

The internal workshops organized in our school are as follows:

- A teacher's workshop was organized from the 15th to the 17th of May 2019 to bring about a marked improvement in our teaching methods with a view to carry out effective class-room teaching and make it more interesting. We imbibed this through many interesting and engaging activities. Stress was also laid on building healthy interpersonal relationships at the workplace.
- A three day workshop on 'Water Conservation' was organised from 21st-23rd Aug.'19 by the Department of Science and Technology.
- A workshop based on providing training to the Science teachers of Prayagraj District for the forthcoming Pre State level of the NCSC competitions following the theme of 'Science and Technology' was held on the 18th of November this year.
- The Congregation for Urban and Rural Environment organized a debate



competition on 14th August' 19 at Bal Bhavan on environmental issues. Two of our students, Sahra Khan of Class 9 and Arpita Kesarwani of Class 8 won the 2nd prize in the Junior and Senior categories respectively.

- On the 18th of July 2019, a workshop on Hubs of Learning was organised at Tagore Public School.
- Our institution has been recognised as the 'hub leader' by the CBSE.
- Nodal Examiners' Training Program by COE Allahabad was held at Tagore Public School on Saturday, 18th January, 2020. The training program was presided over by Madam Swati Gupta, Deputy Secretary, COE Allahabad. All the Principals and examiners were guided and sensitized about the conduction of Board Exam and evaluation procedure.

On 20th November 2019, as a part of a

competition during the Children's Week celebration, a working model based on 'Home-Automation



System' was presented by Hardik Pratap Singh (XII A₁) and Ahmad Farooqui (XII A₂) at Allahabad Museum under the able guidance of Mr Nitin Sharma. They won a gold medal for it.

An extensive workshop on the new and revised curriculum of Fashion Studies at the class XII level (CBSE) was attended by Mrs Arunima Jaiswal at SRS DAV Public College, Mausam Vihar, New Delhi in August 2019.

On 18th October 2019, the Chemistry teachers and the students of the Senior Section of our school attended a set of lectures on Genome Studies of Rice Plant, Periodic Classification and Chemistry in Medicine and Agriculture at the National Academy of Sciences, Prayagraj.

A three-day workshop, 'Art Education Summit 2019' organized by Art Foundation in collaboration with the CBSE was attended by Mrs M Mathur and Mrs M R Chopra at New Delhi from 18th-20th December 2019 to make academics more interesting and catchy; also with a view to facilitate learning and imbibe the lessons with ease. It culminated with thematic workshops on nurturing a vibrant ecosystem for



the arts through a collaboration of various stakeholders.


CBSE RESULTS 2018-19

- 4) Ishaan Tripathi with 93.8% in the Humanities group.






















UNNAYAN-Our Annual Fest 2019

Teach your child to keep the surroundings clean, he should learn to keep his house clean, school and playground clean. A





A CROSS CURRICULAR APPROACH!

Does art help children in other subjects?

The following words of Gurudev
Rabindranath Tagore are possibly the best
answer to this question. In Gitabitan, he says,
"When I see the Universe through my songs, I
recognize it, then only I know it ..."

Art is related to our visual experience. Mental Imagery is an essential part of the thinking process. Visual images are closely related to the mental images. Art makes these images clearer and more concrete.

What do we mean by Art Integration and why it is necessary in education?

Art integration is a **cross curricular approach** to the teaching of the subject with the teaching of Art. The integration is meant not only to make the learning interesting and joyful but also lends itself to imbibing a greater understanding of the art form being utilized for this purpose. For example, integration of Mandala Painting and Circles (Maths) can be achieved by the teacher by taking the students to an open space and asking them to **assemble in co-centric circles**. Then the teacher can introduce and explain about Mandala. Mandala is a design within a

circle that symbolizes the universe. This is how the students can explore the mathematics behind the Mandala.

Today, Art integration is necessary in education because:

Firstly, It helps the child apply art based enquiry, investigation and exploration, critical thinking and creativity for a deeper understanding of the concept.

Secondly, it enables the students to derive understanding directly from learning experiences.

Thirdly, the integration broadens the mindset of the students to see the multi-disciplinary links between the subjects/topics/real life.

Fourthly, it has a positive impact on the development of life skills.

I conclude with the words of Julia Marshall, Professor of Art Education, San Francisco State University, USA, "The focus is not on the colour choices but rather the meaning, thinking and reasoning that the artistic process generates."

Trees

Trees are some of the world's most ancient living beings and make our existence possible. Trees play a very important role in our life. They give us many things like wood, timber, medicines, paper, latex, turpentine, resin, gum and above all the most important thing that is oxygen. Trees like neem, holy basil, aloe-vera, rosy periwinkle give us medicines. There are 60,065 species of trees in the world, according to a comprehensive study of the world's plants.

Trees play a very important role in a human's life because of which life is existing on the earth. Trees can also be classified into herbs, shrubs, climbers, creepers. All humans and animals depend directly or indirectly on trees. Trees are also the food of several animals for example giraffe, deer, elephants etc. Trees also maintain the level of underground water because the water is able to seep into the soil and helps in recharging the underground water. They also prevent soil erosion by binding the soil particles so that they are not eroded by water or air. Trees absorb the water from the soil and release it in the air by the process of transpiration. This increases the humidity and therefore increases the rainfall which cools the air. Trees are also the house of many animals. They provide the best habitat for several animals such as monkeys, bats, apes etc. Birds make their nest on the trees to protect their babies. Insects such as grasshoppers, butterfly, fireflies etc search for shelter among the trees. Trees also maintain the level of carbon di oxide in the environment by absorbing it in the process of photosynthesis. Trees also help in the reduction of air pollution. Trees provide shade and cool air in summers.

Trees play a very important role in the food chain because they are the producers of the food chain. Trees depend on animals for pollination, dispersion of seed, carbon di oxide. When animals die they become fertilizers for plants. Animals also depend on trees for oxygen, food, shelter, etc. It is very important for each and every plant and animal to be present because if they are not present, the whole ecosystem may get disturbed.

Day by day trees are getting destroyed due to various human activities. This is because of the growing population and their never ending demands. Human beings are cutting down the trees for construction of houses, roads, buildings, industries also because of mining, farming, for getting wood, overgrazing etc. Deforestation is sometimes caused due to natural disasters such as drought, forest fire, tsunami etc. Sometimes they are attacked by pests and insects. This is very harmful as it increases the amount of carbon di oxide in the environment which results in the green house effect. It also causes many other problems like melting of polar ice caps, expansion of ocean water, flooding of coastal areas by sea water. It is also expected to cause climatic changes, affecting rain patterns etc.

The destruction of trees can be protected by not cutting trees, planting more and more trees so that they give us more fresh air, using unleaded petrol so that no harmful gases are released in the environment, doing planned harvesting in which only some of the trees are cut and the uncut trees prevent soil erosion. The fruits of these trees will produce seeds so that new plants can be grown. Forest fire must be controlled by using strong blowers to change the direction of wind. We can also conserve trees by wisely using the things generated by forest.

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


