



No matter how dark the night may get, there is a hope of dawn to come. The previous year's pandemic had shaken each and everyone out of his wits. All the necessary provisions and guidelines were made for the smooth and safe functioning of the school in adverse conditions.

The new session embarked on 05 April 2021 in the offline mode for the Senior classes and online mode for the rest of the school. 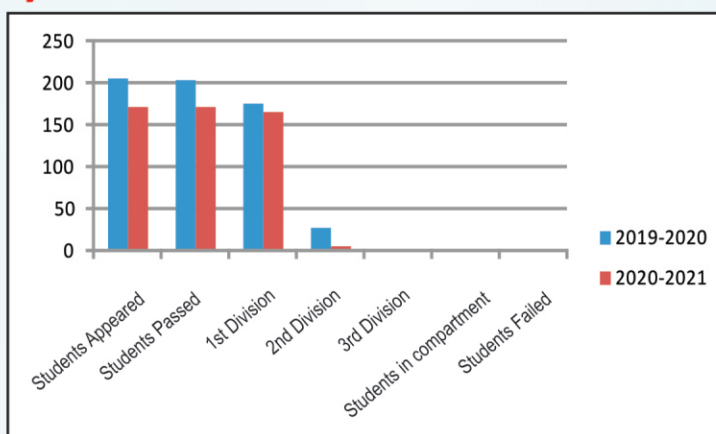
CBSE RESULT 2020-21

The first six years of life are critical since the rate of development in these years is more rapid than at any other stage of development. Research in neuro – science confirms the importance of the early years in child's life particularly since ninety percent of brain development already takes place by the time a child is six years of age. Research also indicates that the development of brain is influenced not only by health, nutrition and quality of care, but also the quality of psycho- socially conducive environment.

So parents should take utmost care of their child in the formative years of his education.

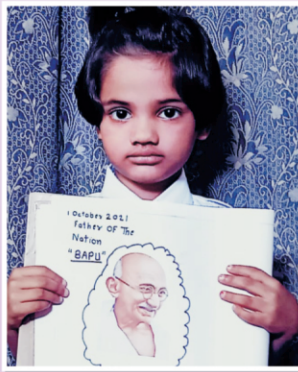
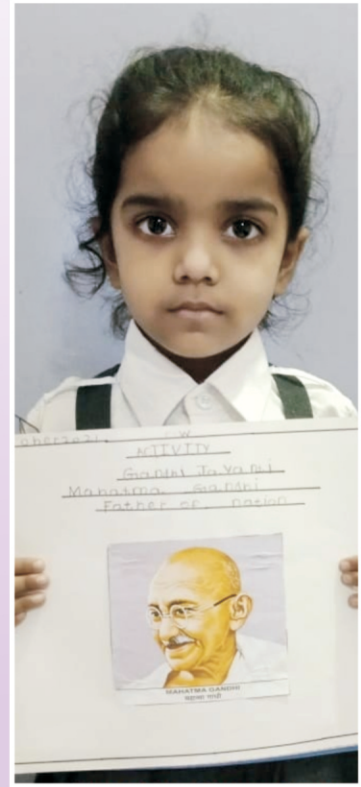

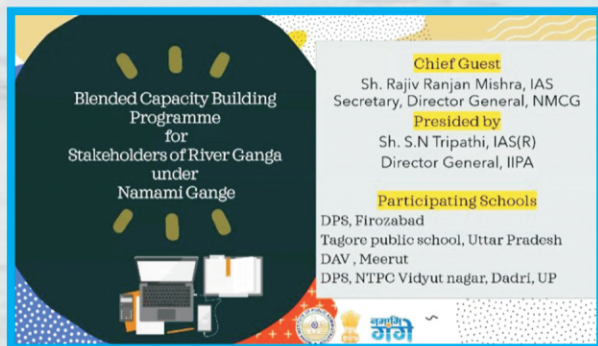
Apart from all these activities, the result of the Poster Making Competition on the topic 'Save Ganga' was also announced in the valedictory session with zest and elation.

The key to curb the COVID-19 pandemic is wide spread vaccination at a rapid pace. Vaccination planning has been a challenge in India. In the beginning, the citizens had to register on the CoWIN or Aarogya Setu portal in order to receive a COVID-19 vaccination. 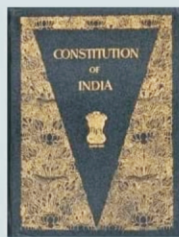

Of Brain close and his bruises.*

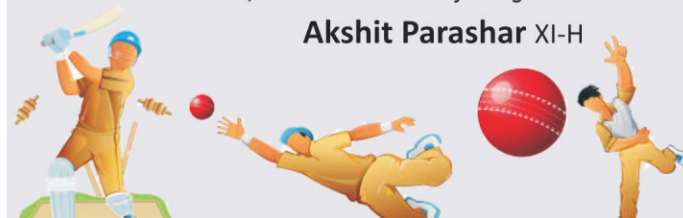
*When Pant and Stokes pulled off that heists,

नई शिक्षा नीति-2020

‘शिक्षा’ किसी भी देश के विकास का प्रमुख आधार है। इसी ठोस शिक्षारूपी स्तम्भ के माध्यम से विश्व-स्तर पर देश की छवि का आंकलन होता है। देश-काल एवं परिस्थितियों के कारण समय-समय पर ‘शिक्षा’ एवं ‘शिक्षा-नीति’ में परिवर्तन होता आया है।

नई शिक्षा नीति 2020 भारत की शिक्षा नीति है, जिसे 34 वर्षों के अन्तराल के बाद भारत सरकार द्वारा 29 जुलाई, 2020 को घोषित किया गया। यह नीति इसरो के अन्तरिक्ष वैज्ञानिक के. कस्तूरीरंगन की अध्यक्षता वाली समिति की रिपोर्ट पर आधारित है। इस रिपोर्ट पर आधारित महत्वपूर्ण तथ्य बिन्दुवार निम्नवत् हैं –

1. इस नीति के तहत वर्ष 2030 तक सकल नामांकन अनुपात (G.E.R.) को 100% लाने का लक्ष्य रखा गया है।
2. नई शिक्षा नीति के अन्तर्गत शिक्षा-क्षेत्र पर सकल घरेलू उत्पाद के 6% हिस्से के सार्वजनिक व्यय का लक्ष्य रखा गया है।
3. ‘मानव संसाधन प्रबन्धन मंत्रालय’ का नाम परिवर्तित कर ‘शिक्षा-मंत्रालय’ कर दिया गया है।
4. पाँचवी कक्षा तक की शिक्षा में मातृभाषा / स्थानीय या क्षेत्रीय भाषा को शिक्षा के माध्यम के रूप में अपनाने पर बल दिया गया है। साथ ही मातृभाषा को कक्षा-8 और आगे की शिक्षा के लिए प्राथमिकता देने का सुझाव दिया गया है।
5. देश भर के ‘उच्च-शिक्षा-परिषद्’ नामक एक एकल नियामक की परिकल्पना की गई है।
6. स्कूलों में 10+2 फार्मेट के स्थान पर 5+3+3+4 फार्मेट को शामिल किया जाएगा। इसके तहत पहले पाँच साल में प्री-प्राइमरी स्कूल के तीन साल और कक्षा 1 एवं कक्षा 2 सहित फाउन्डेशन स्टेज शामिल होंगे। पहले जहाँ सरकारी स्कूल शिक्षा कक्षा 1 से शुरू होती थी वहीं अब तीन साल के प्री-प्राइमरी के बाद कक्षा 1 शुरू होगी। इसके बाद 3-5 के तीन साल शामिल हैं। इसके बाद 3 साल का मिडिल स्टेज (6-8) आएगा। चौथा स्टेज (कक्षा 9-12 तक) 4 साल का होगा। पहले जहाँ 11वीं में विषय चुनने की आज़ादी थी, वही अब 9वीं कक्षा से ही रहेगी।
7. इस शिक्षा नीति में बच्चों के रट्टा विद्या को खत्म करने की कोशिश की गई है, जिसको मौजूदा व्यवस्था की बड़ी खामी माना जाता है।
8. किसी कारणवश विद्यार्थी यदि उच्च शिक्षा के बीच में ही कोर्स छोड़कर चले जाते हैं। ऐसा करने पर उन्हें कुछ नहीं मिलता था एवं उन्हें डिग्री के लिए पुनः नई शुरुआत करनी पड़ती है। नई नीति में पहले वर्ष में ‘कोर्स’ को छोड़ने पर ‘प्रमाण-पत्र’। दूसरे वर्ष पर ‘डिप्लोमा’ एवं अन्तिम वर्ष पर ‘डिग्री’ देने का प्रावधान है।
9. इसी तरह पोस्ट ग्रेजुएट (P.G.) में तीन तरह के विकल्प होंगे—
 - (अ) पहले दो साल का मास्टर्स, उनके लिए जिन्होंने तीन साल का डिग्री कोर्स किया है।
 - (ब) चार साल के डिग्री कोर्स शोध के साथ करने वालों के लिए, ये छात्र एक साल का मास्टर्स अलग से कर सकते हैं।
 - (स) तीसरा विकल्प 5 साल का इंटीग्रेटेड प्रोग्राम। जिसने ग्रेजुएशन और पोस्ट-ग्रेजुएशन दोनों एक साथ ही हो जाये।
 - (द) उच्च शिक्षा के अन्तर्गत एम.फिल. को समाप्त करने का प्रावधान है।

नई शिक्षा नीति एक अच्छी नीति है क्योंकि इसका उद्देश्य शिक्षा प्रणाली को समग्र, लचीला, बहुविषयक बनाना है। इसमें नीति का आश्रय कई मायनों में आदर्श प्रतीत होता है, परन्तु यह वह कार्यान्वयन है, जहाँ सफलता की कुंजी निहित है। नीति का सम्बन्ध पाठ्यक्रम के साथ ‘कौशल-विकास’ पर ध्यान देना है। किसी भी चीज के सपने देखने से वह सार्थक नहीं हो जायेगा, क्योंकि उचित योजना और उसके अनुसार काम करने से उद्देश्य पूरा करने में मदद मिलेगी। जितनी जल्दी एन.ई.पी. (नई शिक्षा नीति) के उद्देश्य प्राप्त होंगे, उतना ही जल्दी हमारा राष्ट्र प्रगति के उच्च शिखर पर पहुँचेगा।

मातृ भाषा - हिन्दी

‘हिन्दी’ हमारी मातृ भाषा ही नहीं है अपितु एक ऐसी भाषा है, जिसे हम दिल से अपनी मातृ भाषा मानते हैं। किसी भी देश के लिए उसकी भाषा या बोली बहुत महत्वपूर्ण होती है और विश्व में हर देश की एक मातृ भाषा जरूर है परन्तु हमारे देश की मातृ भाषा नहीं है और इसका एक बड़ा कारण है हमारे देश की विभिन्नता। हमारा देश इतनी भिन्नताओं से भरा है और चूंकि यहाँ पर इतने धर्मों का पालन किया जाता है इसीलिए किसी भी एक भाषा को मातृ भाषा बनाना संभव नहीं हो रहा। यह हमारे लिए शर्मिन्दगी की बात है। लेकिन इन सब के बावजूद भी हिन्दी भाषा की जगह कोई और भाषा नहीं ले सकती और यह हमारी रोजमर्रा की जिन्दगी का एक अभिन्न अंग बन चुकी है। यह हमारे देश में सबसे ज्यादा बोली जाने वाली भाषा है।

हिन्दी भाषा का प्रमुख इस्तेमाल सरकारी कार्यों में होता है। 1965 में हिन्दी के अलावा और सभी भाषाओं का प्रयोग सरकारी कार्यों के लिए वर्जित किया जाने वाला था परन्तु किसी कारणवश ऐसा नहीं हुआ। तब से आज तक, हिन्दी भाषा को बढ़ावा देने के लिए सरकार ने बहुत कुछ किया है। हम भारतीय कहीं भी चले जाएँ और चाहे कितनी ही भाषाएँ सीख लें परन्तु हिन्दी भाषा की झलक हमारे व्यक्तित्व और हमारे आचरण से कभी नहीं जा सकती और सबसे प्रमुख बात जो हम भारतीयों को या कहें तो भारत में निवास करने वालों को भारतीय बनाती है, वह है हमारा राष्ट्रगान।

प्रमुखतः यह बंगाली में लिखा गया था परन्तु हमारे संविधान ने इसका हिन्दी रूपांतरण अपनाया। यह गान हमारे हृदय में बसा हुआ है और हम चाहें जो भी भाषा बोलते हों, परन्तु उसके पश्चात् भी हिन्दी-लेखन हमें सबसे प्रिय है। हम देश-दुनिया के किसी भी कोने में हों परन्तु यह हिन्दी-गान, हमारा राष्ट्रगान हमें जोड़े रखता है और एकता का एहसास दिलाता है। हिन्दी सभी भारतीयों को, इस भारत को एक जुटता में पिरोये रखती है।

हम अपने जीवन में जो पहला शब्द बोलते हैं, वह भी एक हिन्दी शब्द है यानी ‘माँ’। कोई फर्क नहीं पड़ता हम किस धर्म के हैं, इस धरती पर आने के बाद अगर भारतवासी कोई भाषा सीखता है तो उनमें से सबसे प्रमुख और सबसे प्रथम है- ‘हिन्दी’।

क्या आपको लगता है, यह तीनों भाई-बहन एक साथ सुखपूर्वक सो सकते हैं ? नहीं, क्योंकि तीनों के विचार विपरीत हैं अर्थात् तीनों को एक साथ सोने के लिए एक राय पर सहमत होना आवश्यक है। ऐसे ही हमारे शरीर के आयाम जब एक ही दिशा में कार्य करते हैं, तो हम किसी भी असंभव कार्य को पूर्ण करने में सक्षम हो जाते हैं। इसे ऐसे समझिए यदि आज से 200 वर्ष पहले हम माइक पर बोलते और उसे दुनिया के किसी दूसरे कोने में सुना जाता तो इसे हम आश्चर्य की संज्ञा देते। कोई इसे भगवान का दूत कहता तो कोई भगवान ही कह देता। लेकिन आज यह सामान्य है क्योंकि किसी ने संकल्प लिया था और अपनी पूरी क्षमता से इस दिशा में कार्य किया था।

अतः संकल्प के साथ कोई कार्य करते हैं तो हमारे अंदर वह क्षमता आ जाती है जिससे हम वह स्थान भी प्राप्त कर सकते हैं जो असंभव है।

इसीलिए आज ही एक असंभव लगने वाला संकल्प लीजिए अपने चारों आयाम को उस दिशा में लगा दीजिए और एक असंभव कार्य को संभव कर दिखाइए, विश्व निर्माण में अपना सहयोग दीजिए। आपके संकल्प के पूर्ण होने की प्रतीक्षा पूरा विश्व कर रहा है। अपने संकल्प को ही अपना मंत्र बना लें।

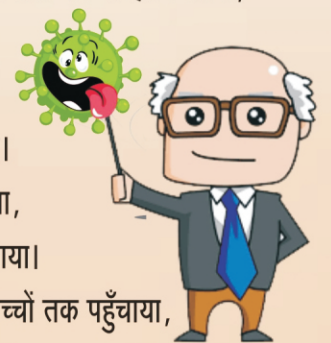

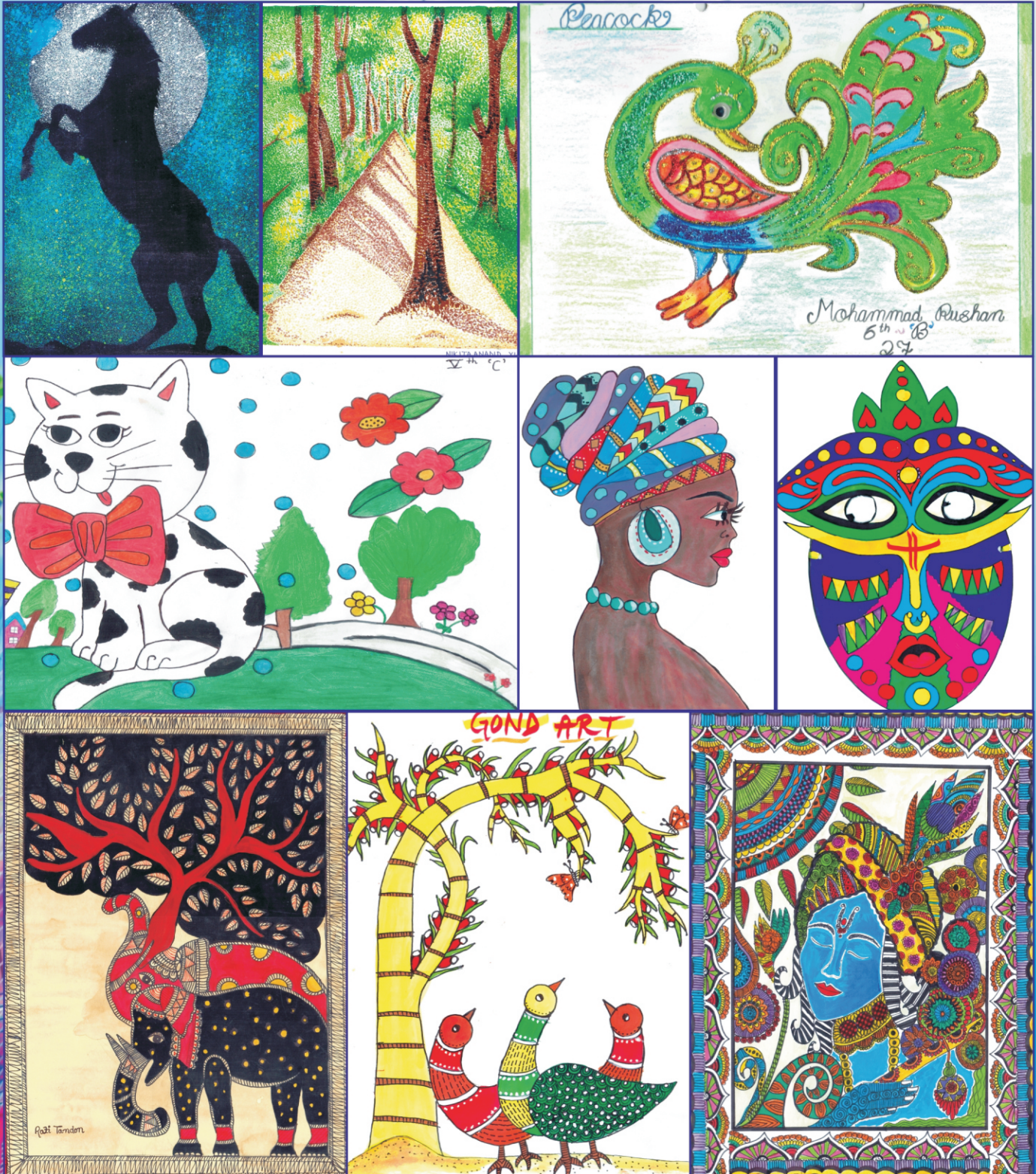

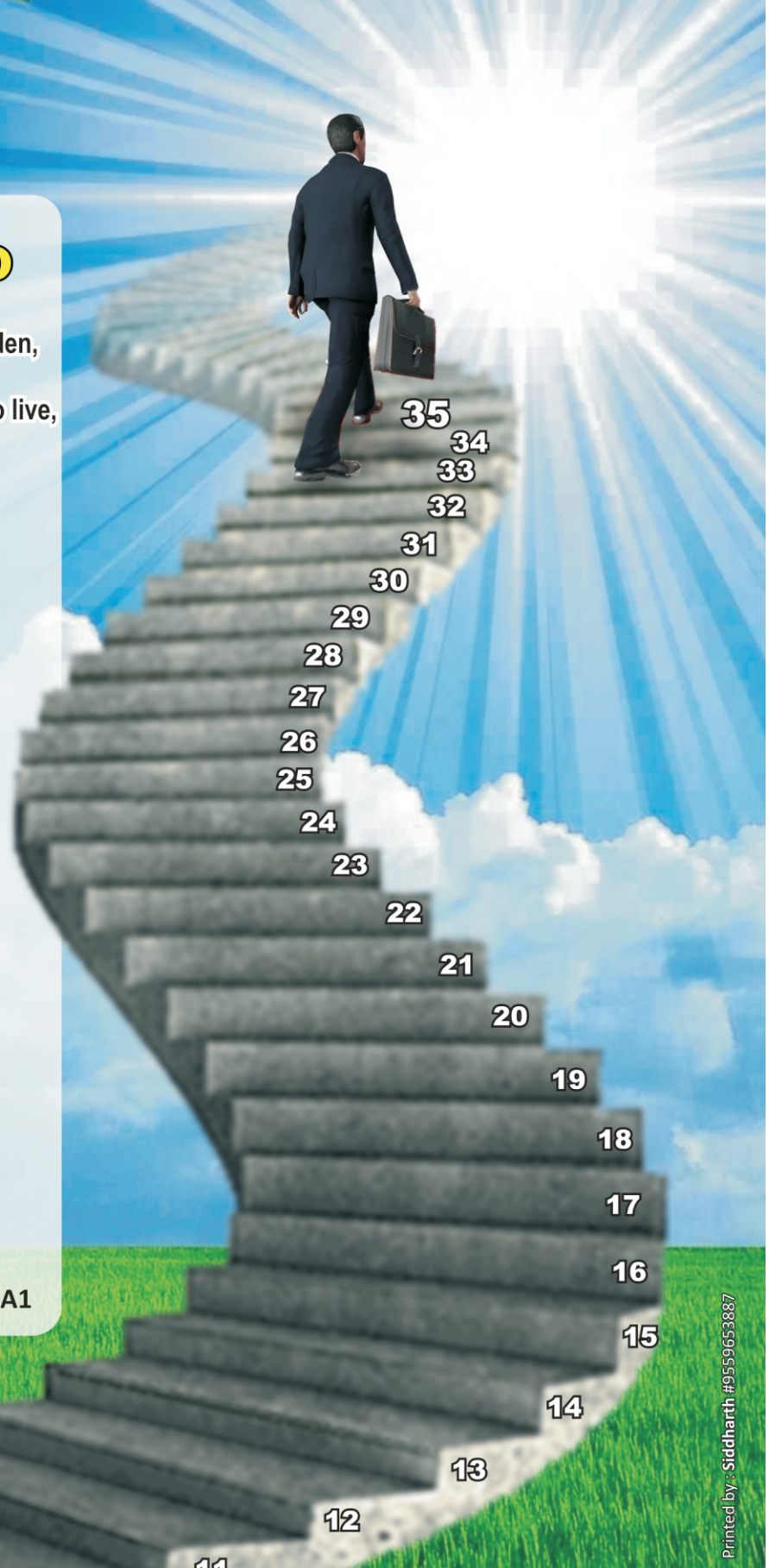
